May 22nd Open Garage at Jack's Place: The Zach Attack!

For club members that are infrequent visitors to Jack's Place, the May 22 presentation was one not to be missed. Zach Merrill of Michelin gave a non-stop three hour presentation on the most important considerations to correct and maintain antique car alignment. He literally was a "marathon man" as he never took a break while illustrating and addressing the critical parameters of car alignment. Starting with the rear axle and rear tire considerations, Zach moved forward to the front end and touched on items rarely discussed. For example (in non-technical terms): in vs. out, left vs. right; camber vs. castor; up



vs. down; round vs. flat; angled vs. straight; torque vs direct forces, degrees vs. linear; slipping vs. skidding, run-out and time, you get the drift. These considerations were explained with great expertise and

humor. Zach gleefully entertained about 15-20 members as he deftly addressed technical issues mixed with real world (and some funny) experiences. It was a job well-done and enjoyed by all.


